With regard to the COVID-19 health pandemic, Council is reviewing operations to ensure the health and safety of our workers, including increased hygiene procedures, implementing split teams to ensure business continuity and working remotely where possible.

Council's media release this week contains the overall response to COVID-19, with up to date information on Council's responses and service changes available at http://www.gilgandra.nsw.gov.au/News/Community-**Updates-COVID-19**

As the situation evolves rapidly, Council has, as of 27th March, taken precautionary measures to 'lockdown' Cooee Lodge and Jack Towney Hostels and is encouraging families to stay connected with their loved ones through telephones and video call technologies. This decision is made in the interest of the health and safety of staff and residents.

The key changes to other services include: Council's Administrative Building in Warren Road is now closed to the is promoting their initiatives and continued services as public and all non-resident staff, however, customer requests can still be received by phone or online. Service NSW will remain open to the public in a restricted form allowing for essential transactions only. Strict social distancing and hygiene arrangements will be put in place to ensure the health and safety of staff and customers.





Oakfield Kelpie Stud — From Misfortune into Success



Local grazier Brendan Butler had the misfortune in 2016 to lose his two treasured working kelpies, either poisoned or lost. To loose two was heart breaking but led Brendan to a housing rethink which resulted in a new dog proof yard and raised kennels at Oakfield. He then turned misfortune into success. Oakfield Kelpie Stud.

Setting up the Stud began after hours of research. Karana Kelpie stud being the stand out, with forty (40) years of breeding the best dogs. Trialling successfully at the highest level had meant Karana had a huge reputation. Brendon liked the style and the temperament of the Karana dogs. "To be successful in utility trialing the dogs have to be calm, with a lot of eye and natural presence for the paddock and be big, strong and forceful in the yard. They are true allrounders." he concluded.

Karana also had a standout dog called Karana Abba II, who was the Don Bradman of trialling. Abba had won over forty open trials including two Australian utility championships and numerous state yard dog titles. Within 18 months, 2 Karana Abba grandsons were secured.

A bitch from A Kennedys Stud at Nyngan was added as an outcross breeder. Since then a bitch from Karabah stud bloodlines and another Karana bitch, who has Abba as a grandfather have been added to compliment the 2 Karana males. Two years on and Karana Tom VI, and Karana Roy Boy are maturing into excellent all-round work dogs, and are both big, strong and good looking

with classic kelpie features. An added bonus is their lovely friendly temperament. They have also been to a few yard dog trials and have progressed quickly to novice grade. Karana Tom has also been in demand as a stud sire. His natural ability, pedigree and classic good looks has seen him joined to bitches from Motleys Kelpie stud at Nyngan and Broxhill Kelpies, Curban.

Brendan, now has a great team of working dogs and says he enjoys a day of sheep or cattle work to watch their progress.

A-Kennedys Queenie and Broxhill Bonnie are now working nicely and are at breeding age. With pups currently on the ground, some will be for sale, they are affordable Kelpie pups bred from some of the best genetics available.

Brendan advised, Pups will have their first vaccination and be registered with the WKC at 8 weeks of age. He is also offering help starting pups if this is needed.


