Tower for Tooraweenah - Telstra - Progress.

In May of this year Tooraweenah CWA agreed to take up this project to find the most appropriate mobile communication for Tooraweenah Village so businesses, residents, visiting professionals, emergency services and visitors could keep in touch via mobile phone and internet without having to travel up to the viewing platform.

Telstra engineers have since visited the village and identified Tooraweenah is in a Black Spot area and that a tower with wireless connection would produce the best outcome, covering a radius of 1klm within the village.

Confirmation was received on Monday 1st July from Michael Marom, Northern NSW General Manager Telstra, that they will include Tooraweenah for consideration in their Round 5 submission of the Black Spot program.

Mark Coulton MP Member for Parkes, Minister for Regional Services, Decentralisation and Local Government, Roy Butler MP, Member for Barwon and Gilgandra Shire Council have all been informed of progress and are working cooperatively towards a great outcome which is long overdue for our community.

The NSW Government has now committed \$400 Million to a Mobile Phone Black Spot program for Regional NSW as part of their 2019/2020 Budget. The details regarding how to access these funds are not yet available, but as the representative for the area, Roy Butler, MP will be pushing for Tooraweenah to be placed as a high priority for these upgrades and funding.

The closing date for submissions from the Telco's has been extended from 26th July to the 26th September 2019.

With such wonderful support and cooperation from our community, Telstra and all levels of Government it is hoped the full cost for the tower of \$114,000 will be fully covered.
