We feel we have a responsibility to you, your family and our community to take this unprecedented action. This is only the second time in 104 years that the show has not been held."

Incoming office bearers are President Ben Gale; Secretary Kristy Gale; Assistant Secretary and Grants Officer Kylie Moppett; Vice Presidents, Will Bowman and Brendan Butler; Treasurer Brian Mockler; Assistant Treasurer and Public Officer Lester Thurston; Publicity Officer Sue Armstrong.

The Show Grounds and facilities are available for hire under strict Covid-19 restrictions and a "COVID -19 Safety Plan" needs to be lodged with the Secretary prior to the event.

President Ben Gale said, "During the next twelve months the Show Committee plan on holding several smaller events – within strict COVID-19 Guidelines. Events such as Working Dog Trials,

Equestrian Activities and Family Friendly Events. Work continues upgrading the showgrounds with plans for new amenities as well as ongoing grant applications."

"Dog trial yards and upgrade to the arena have commenced and will be a bonus for show visitors and competitors alike.

"Our Grants Officer Kylie Moppett continues to keep busy organising and writing grants for facilities. Thank you Kylie. It is a big job."

"Smaller events are able to continue at the grounds, such as Pony Group, organised horse events and the Golf Club program. Please, don't forget, if you book an event have a COVID-19 Safety Plan completed." Ben concluded.

(\$10k). That the Council contribution be considered at the August Council meeting.



Gilgandra Shire Council — General Manager Reports

Roads Update:

With significant rainfall again falling across the Gilgandra Shire over recent weeks, our rural roads are incurring significant additional damage and are simply too damp at this point to carry out effective restoration works. In the interim, Council is planning to deliver a Shire wide maintenance grading program to our unsealed rural road network, where conditions permit. These works will ensure roads are safely passable whilst smoothing out some of the potholes and corrugations, especially coming in to what we hope to be a busy harvest season.

Maintenance grading is expected to commence in the south eastern quadrant of the Shire. We expect full restoration works on rural roads to commence following this and as weather permits. Restoration works will consist of formation and reconstruction grading, desilting of table drains and culverts, reinstating lost gravel and repairs to floodways'. We appreciate there continues to be a period of rough roads and frustration for road users, and Council continues to undergo processes through the NSW Government Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements to optimise the funding potential and longer term benefit for our ratepayers.

We would ask residents to avoid any unnecessary travel on the unsealed rural roads during periods of wet weather, particularly by heavy vehicles, plant and machinery. Council will continue emergency works where roads present an immediate risk and Council will instigate temporary rectification measures.

Council will provide further updates regarding the disaster declaration process and works schedule once details become available and weather permitting. We invite you to submit customer requests or report an issue online



Tooraweenah Bore:

Work on the new Tooraweenah water supply bore, at the corner of Amy & Brennan Streets, is scheduled to recommence following the arrival on-site of new equipment and concrete buildings. The project will involve the installation of the bore pump, pipe work, telemetry and associated controls.

Councillors Corner – Cr Brian Mockler Reports!



Councillors' continue to make representations in relation to the condition of our rural roads network.

Customer complaints and customer requests should be lodged online whenever possible.

The level of genuine road conditions flood damage and general deterioration of gravel road conditions complaints is now significant. Unfortunately there is no simple solution given the magnitude of what is required.

Separate rain events, I understand since February, now total 3. This has resulted in flood damage claims, which take time for processing, and if approved, are limited to funding for "localised" restoration works only.

Flood damage submission 1 has now been approved and works are scheduled to commence, but they are not in the Tooraweenah area. It is envisaged a 2 stage restoration process may be implemented, subject to weather conditions.

Kathryn Larkin's Community Engagement team are working on disseminating information to be made available to rural residents, which will highlight what works will be done, priorities, and the planned road works schedule.

Berakee Quarry intersection on Collie Road has been completed.

Councillors' have had a briefing on progress on the Inland Rail project through Gil Shire. An Environmental Impact Statement will be prepared once corridor alignment is finalised. Work has commenced on the DA and Master Plan for the Grain Corp Industrial Precinct.

Council decided upon Rural Roads Betterment Program \$355k funding, allocated to Biddon Creek erosion restoration, Dooroombah Rd concrete causeway over a culvert.

Tooraweenah Preschool 'Developing Wings of Independence'

We have all had a restful school holiday break and everyone was happy to return to preschool. We are excited to welcome 'Miss Leonie" (Harvey) as our new bus driver three days a week, allowing Miss Marie and Miss Shannon more time to get ready for each day's special activities and learning experiences.

The children have enjoyed playing with our new jungle animal figurines that we have added to our collection and were excited to discover there are also some unicorn figurines. (Unicorns are a favourite mystical animal for several of our preschool friends.)

The saying "A picture says a thousand words" has been evident at preschool with our new mini posters of Aboriginal symbols, being displayed throughout our room. (See photo below)



Miss Marie was sent this resources kit from a colleague who is the Aboriginal Liaison Officer at her school. They include symbols representing items such as mountains, waterholes, people, campsites and gatherings, animals, weapons, and nature in general and are universal, allowing them to be used on all Aboriginal country. The children easily and confidently recognize these symbols now and have really taken to looking at and discussing the different symbols, with a clear understanding of what each symbol represents and means. This has been learnt in a very short amount of



time. The children have even taken to drawing symbols and pictures in the sandpit (*see photo above*) and related these back to the symbols on display in our room.

We have enjoyed reading several stories each day, including some based around Aboriginal culture and Aboriginal artwork / pictures that have generated some interesting discussions, with children freely sharing their thoughts and ideas. We have been busy singing and dancing to both Miss Marie playing the piano and to the CD's.
