Students measured, drilled, screwed and built six garden beds in total, showing their understanding of the processes involved in creating 'wicking beds.

Principal, Karen Smith and her team are very thankful to the WEEC staff for their support and expertise.

All six 'wicking beds' have been planted out with seedlings and students have been tending these daily. Students and staff from the (WEEC) have done an amazing job creating these beds and everyone can't wait to reap the harvest!

In 4-12 weeks there could be a surplus of vegetables including spinach, broccoli, cabbage, lettuce, beetroot and chives.

Karen says she has been impressed with the number of students taking a keen interest in spending their lunchtimes creating pathways of bark chips around the new garden beds and tending to the watering.

Gilgandra Shire Council — General Manager Reports

As social distancing restrictions start to • ease, Council facilities are making the appropriate changes to their operations, with many services now open to the public again for the first time since March.

We welcome the relaxation of social distancing measures, but remain equally cautious and continue to monitor advice from NSW Health and the Australian and NSW Governments regarding COVID 19.

Regional tourism has also kicked into gear, with travellers becoming more prominent through our region, with many stopping and spending in our town and villages.

A few topics of interest this month:

Council adopted the 2020/21 Budget and Operational Plan at its meeting held Tuesday 23rd June, which includes a Dump Point to be located at the Tooraweenah Caravan Park.

• The newly constructed walking track from Tooraweenah to the lookout is certainly getting some use, however we'd like to remind users that it is for pedestrians and cyclists only, and should not be used by motorbikes and vehicles. The creek crossing section will be completed as weather conditions permit.

Sealing works along John Renshaw • Drive are planned for the coming weeks, however progress is weather

dependent. Council is aware the road conditions are still of concern and assure residents that the flood damage claim process remains underway and we are working through this as efficiently as possible. The GIL is set to open by the end of June, which will also be home to Visitor Information while the Coo-ee Heritage Centre upgrades are undertaken. If you've had a sneak peak in the windows of the former Target building, you would have seen a wide variety of items on display so be sure

Kevin's philosophy is to breed the best to the best, which he has done for years with outstanding results. Kevin's pups are weaned at 6-7 weeks onto high protein puppy bics, supplemented with mince meat and

fed twice a day. At 8 weeks, pups are vaccinated for Parvo and distemper and wormed, this is repeated again at 12 weeks. Pups are micro chipped, tattooed then

registered with Kelpie Council to record their pedigree. Kevin suggests doing plenty of research into the type of dog you want, and buy from a

Projects include fabrication and installation of portable dog trial yards, rodeo arena upgrades and modern facilities.

What a busy few weeks' we have had at Tooraweenah Preschool, with lots of laughs, lots of fun and friendship, and some very busy and clever children totally engaged in our preschool activities and experiences, both inside and outside!



We have been enjoying the outside, playing 'fruit shops' in our newly revamped cubby house. This is an amazing game the children

have invented, using small coloured balls as fruit and selling lots of strawberries, blueberries, avocados, pineapples, oranges and grapes, making sure the shop keeper was kept very busy! This has been a lovely social game to see emerge and children have played it daily.



We have also enjoyed our new 'tools table' where the children are using our newly purchased 'real tools' to tinker, pull apart and rebuild items

(well, sort of!) Miss Shannon recently brought in an old fax machine and radio with lots of screws in it much to the children's delight. We are looking for some 'loose parts' (old items) for our 'tools table'- if you have some old bits and pieces that are not too big but would be easy for the children to pull apart, we would love to have them! (We do have to be mindful of sharp and/or dangerous parts when thinking of 'loose parts' items). Recently we have had some work completed in our playground, removing the shutters on the cubby window, getting our picnic chairs and tables being repaired, establishing a

new veggie garden area using our wicking beds and the removal of the old large steel air conditioning unit and ducts from the building. This has given us more light inside and when all works are completed and landscaped, a new look playground to enjoy.

Other exciting news for preschool is beautiful sunshine that we have finally got a land line telephone installed!!! Our new preschool telephone number is 6848 1060. Even the children have been excited to hear the phone when it rings!



We were very excited to receive our new big carpet mat, with the children enjoying this new play space, recently playing with new farm animals and Miss Marie's sheep and cattle yards; as well as dancing here - we love our new dances "The Kangaroo Rock" and "The Silly Sausage Dance". We've painted some wooden penguins along with our friends at Tooraweenah Public School for the Antarctic Exhibition in Hobart and have enjoyed singing several new songs, including 'Brumby Jack' and "Kookaburra Sits In The Old Gum Tree' in both English and Wiradjuri.

We've been experimenting with colours, shapes, textures and patterns and having a lovely time experimenting and investigating how colours mix together to make new colours through different art experiences, including straw blow painting, butterfly printing and eye
