TO THE FIRST ARMATREE VILLAGE MANAGEMENT PLAN.

This plan serves as a roadmap for community-led change. It presents a shared vision, created for Armatree by its community.

We have many assets. Agriculture provides a strong foundation for our local economy, and we've become a well-loved destination for long-term travellers and day trippers alike. But we also have challenges, like securing funding as a small community and ensuring the upkeep of community assets.

This plan considers all these factors, and presents a vision for the community we would like to maintain and grow into the future.

We recognise the many people who have contributed to the vibrant social and economic life of Armatree. This plan builds on our strong history, and the contribution of groups such as the Armatree Progress Association, CWA and others.

The consultation process for our Village Management Plan has shown that our community is engaged in deciding its own future.

In 2023, Gilgandra Shire Council established an internal working committee made up of cross-collaborative teams – including infrastructure, planning and development, activation, communications and finance – to coordinate planning in Tooraweenah and Armatree. Local people had the opportunity to be involved in a dedicated consultation session held at the Armatree Hotel. People also had their say through email, the Council website and social media. All of this feedback was combined with information gathered in other forums – such as Real Country and Regional Drought Resilience consultations – to create this plan.

While the plan has been created under the stewardship of the Council, it is up to all of us to bring it to life. Together, we have an opportunity to drive positive change in and around Armatree while staying true to our community values. Throughout the plan, you'll find different ways you can get involved. This might be through small day-to-day actions, or collective projects and advocacy.

The plan will be reviewed in line with the Gilgandra Region Community Strategic Plan and integrated planning and reporting requirements.

To the Armatree community, thank you for your participation in creating this plan and your dedication to its success.



While Council has a custodial role in initiating and preparing this Village Management Plan on behalf of the community, it is considered a community-owned plan. The plan will inform aspects of Council's plans and programs through its relationship with the Community Strategic Plan, within the wider integrated planning and reporting framework. This framework demonstrates how the many Council plans, programs and reporting work together, to achieve positive outcomes for our community.







Our village

Officially declared a village in 1912, Armatree's story stretches back much further. European settlers arrived in the 1830s, following the footsteps of John Jude who established the first "Armatree Run" along the Castlereagh River. By the mid-1880s, a school and post office had been built, catering to a growing community.

The true catalyst for Armatree's development arrived in 1903: the railway. The construction of the Dubbo-Coonamble branch line brought a surge of activity. Large crews camped in the area, laying the stilloperational railway track with horse drawn scoops and plough.

As part of the Gilgandra Region, we're known for our welcoming community and incredible natural landscape. As we look to the future, our community is focused on encouraging community spirit and pride we've long been known for. This includes maintaining and improving local assets and promoting Armatree as a tourist destination.

Our history boards share our rich past with visitors and major local events are helping us transform from a hidden gem to a well-travelled location. As a community, we're eager to improve our village and assets to enhance village life, and promote our home for its 'Real Country' lifestyle.

CHALLENGES

The intent of this plan is to be realistic and achievable. We have many assets, but we also have challenges to overcome.

- **Awareness:** Armatree is a hidden gem, competing for tourism against better-known destinations.
- **Community care and maintenance:** Shared and privately-owned assets in the community require upkeep.
- **Infrastructure:** Road quality impacts the economic flow of goods and services and tourism experience.
- **Funding:** As a small village, Armatree needs to strategically allocate limited resources or seek advocacy for alternative funding.
- Employment and engagement: 34% of residents are not engaged in the labour force (REMPLAN)
- **Advocacy:** Gathering evidence and support for funding initiatives is challenging.
- Infrastructure: Road quality impacts the economic flow of goods and services and tourism experience.
- **Tourism services and employment:** While tourism presents a major opportunity for economic growth, tourism only supports 75 jobs across the entire Gilgandra Region (REMPLAN).
