

#### Arthur Butler Museum - History Revisited



Arthur Butler was 162.5cm of high energy, enthusiasm and ideas, who would spend almost 40 years as a key figure in Australian aviation. He is the ' forgotten aviator,' a visionary who kept a promise to bring air services to Tooraweenah and subsequently make Tooraweenah, per head of population the most air minded centre in Australia.

Following is a Recollection from the late Andy Zell's Memoir of the Late Arthur Butlers' visit to School.....

"In that talk he gave us, one story about the seagull I particularly remember; he was in this little plane, being buffeted by a hailstorm, and he was beginning to wonder if he was ever going to get out of it. And then suddenly, he was hit in the chest with something. "Oh my God," he thought, "The plane's dismantling. It's falling apart" Instead of that it was a seagull that fell into his lap. And then it sort of untangled itself, and of course, you can imagine, the poor bird, coming to and it's in this strange place.

And it sat there in his lap for a while with all the vibration and noise, and then after a while it got up and straightened its wings out and preened itself. And there he was, he's in this storm and its on his lap, and I can still hear him today, say, that that bird being in his lap gave him the courage to keep battling on. Because if it thought it was safe there in that little plane, then he could be also; and then when they came out of the storm in the sunlight, the seagull sort of looked around and saw the air had cleared and it preened its feathers for a bit, and had another bit of a look then hopped up on the side of the cockpit just beside his head; and sat there for a bit, as he said, he didn't move much and it didn't frighten the bird, and then it just ..... dropped of into the slipstream. And I can still hear him saying, the comfort that that bird gave him; it gave him the strength, you know, to reinforce his courage to go on ....."

And then the day he came to school. It was while he was resting in Tooraweenah after his flight out from England. I mean we were only kids but I can remember him - he had all the time in the world to explain things to you if you had a question to ask him.

I think it was the day after he taxied the plane up to Mr Garling's store. He gave us a résumé of where he'd been.

We had a map of the world hanging up on one wall, and Mr Butler had this broom

handle with a nail in one end, and he used to put the nail on the point of the map he was talking about — and he gave us this picture of when he left England. He started at a Park and then the rough water over the channel, and that was only the beginning, he said, and then he flew over France; Mount Vesuvius, I can remember him mentioning it; I don't remember the words he used but I can remember this picture he gave us of the steam trailing out of the top of it; and then the beautiful green olive groves in Greece; that still sticks with me.

I don't know how much fuel it (the Comper Swift) held or how much he had to have, but he had to have a specialist delivery of fuel to somewhere in the Middle East and, I think it was the Vacuum Oil Company, had to keep finding him if he didn't land where he was supposed to land. And of course he got caught up in this sand-storm in Arabia or across this big desert and they had to find him before he flew off over India to Calcutta.

For a kid that age to be able to remember everything he told us on that day, more than seventy years later. He made it so easy to understand him. He brought himself down to our level. "Is that clear" he's say. He didn't mind how many questions we had to ask him.
