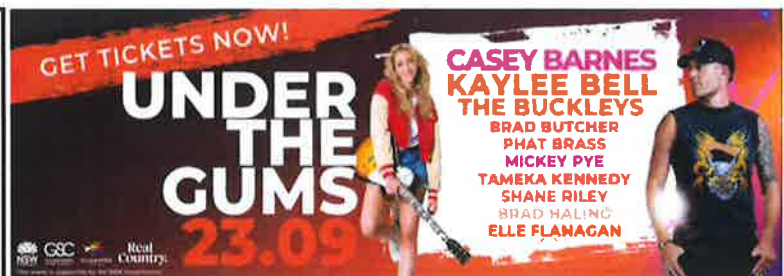

Tooraweenah Preschool, 'Developing Wings of Independence' Marie Gale (Jacobsen)

We recently celebrated "Science Week" at Tooraweenah Preschool.



We had a great time doing fun experiments and investigations each day. Just prior to Science Week, we enjoyed working together on a measuring experience using an Emu Egg and Chicken Eggs. These created a great deal of provocations, curiosity and questions. We 'held' each egg to feel how heavy it was before putting them into the scales to see what one Emu egg would weigh compared to the chook eggs. We discovered it was the same as 12 chicken eggs, and then we cracked the emu egg open and took a good look at this large yolk, before repeating the same process with the chicken eggs: without the shells, the 12 chicken eggs were ever so slightly heavier than the emu egg.

Thanks to Thea and Miss Shannon for supplying the eggs! We continue to enjoy measuring various items with the scales, and also the measuring tapes.

During Science Week, we checked out some real shark teeth and took notice of how big and sharp they are compared to our teeth, then we used a book to research this concept further. Did you know that sharks have 7 rows of teeth and their skin makes more teeth when they lose one??

Pictured right, enjoying creating volcanos in the sandpit and watching them erupt. Eloise suggested we put all of the lava into one larger container to

see if it "would explode more". This theory proved correct, with the lava leaving some rather interesting "bubble" patterns on the sand where it had flowed.



The next day we decided to fly into space with a fun tea-bag rocket ship experiment. This had the children totally mesmerised, so we used as many Lipton teabags as Miss Marie had. (The other brands have a seam across the 'middle' so you can't unfold it into a 'tall, skinny rocket' after you remove the tag and staple.)

We wish Shannon Brown all the best as she has resigned from her position. The children worked as a team and created a colourful 'rainbow' poster "thank you" card for Miss Shannon. We thank our casual staff Jaimee, Miss Gina and Mrs Quilter for joining us at preschool for our fun and busy days.

We had a wonderful visit from Gulargambone Preschool on Wednesday 23rd August for a fabulous play-date



together on their way past from a visit to the Emu Farm. We hope to have them visit us again for a joint "Bush Preschool" session before the end of term. We are all looking forward to our visit to "Thea's



Emu Farm", and are quite excited about learning more about the emus, and having a picnic after saying hello to them in two weeks' time.

Our shared reading with Tooraweenah Public School students and our Bush Preschool programme have continued each week on alternate Wednesdays and Fridays. We are so very fortunate to be able to do this. Everyone enjoys our story sessions with the big school friends, and a big 'thank you' to our parent/family helpers for joining us on our Bush Preschool fun down at the Tooraweenah Creek. We have been noticing some changes in our close environment also with the trees and gardens as we head into spring.

Preschool friends have been very busy getting ready for Father's Day with lots of hard work and effort going into each individual child's gift. There has been quite a few steps involved so it has taken us several weeks to complete this 'project'. Our Dad's will love it! Fence Sitters Welcome 13th & 14th September Working Dog School.



September 13th and 14th are the dates set for Tooraweenah Show Societies second working dog school for 2023.

With only 2 weeks to go, the Gary White run School, is fully booked, and while there are no more spots available at this sitting, anyone who is interested in what is involved in properly training a working dog is more than welcome to come and sit in, as fence sitters.

While not getting the benefit of being able to work your own dog under the watchful eye of Gary, fence sitting is still a very good way of learning what is involved to get the best out of your trusty four legged workmate.

Gary goes into a lot of detail in his talks on the different drills and each stage of the dogs training and then backs the talk up with demonstrations with his own champion kelpies.

(Gary White has won the Australian National Kelpie Utility Championship multiple times.)

Attendees then get to work their own dogs, starting with basic balancing up the dog, to a few quiet sheep, in a controlled round yard and progressing to harder drills in the bigger setting of a paddock near the yards.

Gary explains and shows drills to teach the dogs sides, a proper stop, left and right casts, how to teach a dog to back sheep, the list goes on.

The cost to fence sit is a \$20 donation to the show, students free, and if the first school is anything to go by there could be more fence sitters than handlers.

If anyone is interested in sitting in at the dog school, please come along, no need to book in.

The school will start on Wednesday the 13th of September at COLPA Woolshed at 9.00am. Tooraweenah Lions Club will provide lunch.

Local Team — Jo's Jalopy Raising Funds For Cancer Research Driving a Shitbox!

After surviving their first Shitbox rally in March this year, Jo and Joe Miller, team Jo's Jalopy, are saddling up to take on the Autumn Shitbox rally in April 2024. This will see them driving their trusty 1997 Mitsubishi Triton 2WD Ute, with over 460,000km on the clock, from Adelaide, SA to Perth, WA via Uluru, NT.

What is a Shitbox rally?

It is a challenge to drive a car worth \$1500 or less across some of the most formidable roads across Australia. All cars must be 2WD which only adds to the excitement! Each rally has around 250 teams (of 2 people) registered along with support teams totaling around 550 people. The routes are a mixture of sealed and unsealed, usually taking the most scenic drive to the destination. The rally takes place over 7 days with the option of auctioning off your car at the end with all proceeds being donated to the Cancer Council.

To participate in the rally each team must raise a minimum of \$5000 in the lead up to their rally. Any money raised over and above the \$5000 is a bonus and helps boost the total funds raised for the Cancer Council. The rally Jo and Joe participated in earlier this year from Rockhampton, QLD to Hobart, TAS raised \$2.06 million for the Cancer Council.

So, between now and April 2024 Jo and Joe will be working to raise funds for the rally and will have a few fundraising activities happening. 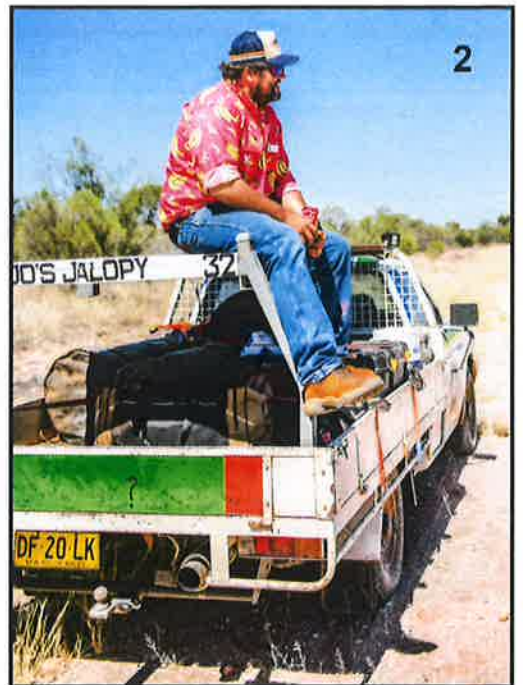

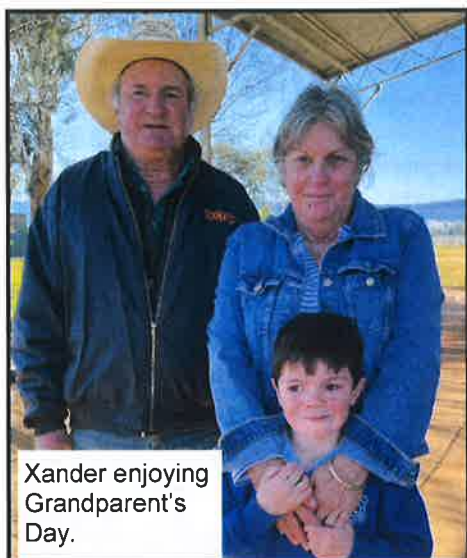
