MILLER STREET, GILGANDRA

A country town wouldn't be complete without a great main street. Find restaurants, cafes, a bakery and retail boutiques all within a short walk. Visit our Coo-ee Bronze Sculpture commemorating the centenary of the Coo-ee March.



MURAL TOUR

Our streets are full of colour. Murals illustrating life in Gilgandra and historical events, can be found along Miller Street, Bridge Street and Wamboin Street. Peek below the Jack Renshaw Bridge to see artwork by local Aboriginal artists.



HUNTER PARK

Stop for a picnic under Hunter Park's century old plane trees, only 200 metres from the CBD. Bring the family and enjoy the modern kids play equipment, skate park, public BBQ and the Gilgandra Swimming Pool.

ORANA CACTUS WORLD

Explore up to 1,000 species of cacti collected from around the world all in one place.

WINDMILL WALK

Walk this 4 kilometre return trail between the Gilgandra Museum and Gilgandra CBD and view our historic windmills. It's a flat, easy river-side walk, perfect to bike or scoot with the kids.



GILGANDRA FLORA RESERVE

Walk through 8 hectares of native bushland filled with rare and endangered plants. Flowers bloom from August to November. With BBQ, picnic tables, shelters, toilets and water; why not stay and enjoy the day! Open 7 days, free entry.



HITCHEN HOUSE

See where the Hitchen Brothers started the 1915 Coo-ee March that put Gilgandra on the map. Their original home is viewable from Miller Street, Gilgandra.
